At the HBWC, we offer our volunteers a wide range of opportunities to get involved, including citizen science, social media management, supporting workshops, wetland walks and Open Days. We promote HBWC at public events such as the Hobsons Bay City Council (HBCC) Volunteer Expo and local festivals. Other volunteer opportunities focus on our fundraising and administrative duties.

This approach guides how we plan and manage programs to comply with relevant legislation and assess potential hazards, risks, and impacts on the environment, including cultural and heritage sites.

Induction

This Volunteer Handbook provides essential information about an introduction to the available volunteering roles and information about your role. We require all volunteers to complete a registration form with their contact details and emergency contact information, as well as their areas of interest.

- Follow any reasonable instructions given by HBWC in relation to health and safety
- Handle HBWC equipment with care
- Uphold HBWC values in working towards our vision and undertaking tasks with professionalism.
- Undergo any necessary security checks and abide by HBWC policies and procedures.
- Adhere to the HBWC advice provided by the Volunteer Supervisor to dress appropriately for the activity in accordance with OH&S requirements.
- Wear identification when carrying out activities.
- Contribute their time, unique skills, and knowledge.
- Provide honest feedback to ensure ongoing improvement of HBWC volunteer programs.

Volunteer Application Process

- 1. To apply to become a volunteer, please check out our website and attend one of our activities to familiarise yourself with our organisation and meet other volunteers.
- 2. Complete our volunteer registration form and email it to hbwcgroup@email.com. Often, HBWC events offer the opportunity to complete this form and hand it to the Volunteer Supervisor at the time. Be sure to specify the activities you are interested in volunteering for and when you would be available.
- 3. After we receive your application, the relevant Volunteer Supervisor will contact you about the role you're interested in. Please be aware that it may take a few days for us to get in touch with you.
- 4. We will then add you to our volunteer register and keep you informed of future volunteering opportunities.

Citizen Science:

Our Citizen Science opportunities enable members of the public to assist in collecting information about our natural world and contribute to conservation efforts. Volunteers will help run and participate in programs like wildlife monitoring, which plays a vital role in protecting and enhancing biodiversity. Regular monitoring of multiple sites can also help us build a better understanding of the natural world and how it is changing.

Conservation:

HBWC is the Guardian of the Key Biodiversity Area of the Altona and Cheetham Wetlands. Volunteers with experience in bird identification and survey methods help us monitor the health of birds in the wetlands in partnership with Birdlife Australia.

Visitor Information & Event Hosts

Our volunteers play a critical role in organising and running events, such as Open Days, that promote environmental awareness and education. As a volunteer, you might help with setting up displays and assisting visitors with information. Volunteers with knowledge of local flora and fauna, answer questions about our wetland ecosystems and the unique wildlife that call it home.

Nature Guides

HBWC volunteers have the opportunity to work as nature guides and lead nature walks, sharing their knowledge and enthusiasm for the local flora and fauna with visitors. Your role as a guide is to educate and inspire visitors, encouraging them to appreciate the natural world and its importance to our ecosystem. By volunteering as a nature guide at our wetlands centre, you can share your passion for nature and make a positive impact on the community by promoting environmental awareness and education. All our walks have volunteer support if you want to learn more about being a guide and helping participants.

Educational Activities

Volunteers at our wetlands centre will help deliver educational activities that teach visitors about the environment and help reconnect people with nature. As a volunteer, you might help with planning and leading workshops, developing educational materials, or delivering talks on topics related to wetlands conservation and ecosystem management that encourage visitors to become active participants in environmental conservation and preservation efforts.

Fundraising

HBWC is reliant on grants for some of its projects, and as a volunteer with research and writing skills, you will identify relevant grants, plan our application schedule for the year and develop proposals that will help us deliver our programs.

Public Relations and Communication

HBWC volunteers handle our Public Relations and communications, including public speaking to community groups, radio interviews, researching and writing articles for publication across various media, newsletters, social media and keeping our website up to date.

Committee and Office Administration

Our Committee is always looking for volunteers who can also help with administrative and office duties, which might include assisting with data entry and record keeping, answering phones, and responding to emails, filing, assisting with event planning and coordination and providing support to staff members with various tasks as needed. Our Committee of Management is also made up of volunteers who are elected at our AGMs.

Training and Development

At the Hobsons Bay Wetlands Centre, we are dedicated to the training and development of our volunteers. We believe that volunteering is a mutually beneficial process, and we aim to provide support and training for all volunteer tasks. As we are a volunteer organisation, we rely on Volunteer Supervisors to provide on-the-job training. The Committee welcomes input at any time from all volunteers about training content and potential delivery.

Workplace Health and Safety

As a volunteer organisation that conducts conservation and environment workshops for the general public, it is important to prioritize the health and safety of our volunteers, staff, and participants. We are committed to complying with all relevant health and safety legislation, regulations, and standards, as well as implementing our own internal policies and procedures.

We provide training to our volunteers and staff on relevant health and safety topics to ensure they are aware of potential hazards and risks and how to mitigate them. We will also conduct risk assessments for all activities and events and implement appropriate control measures to minimize risks.

It is essential to prioritise your safety when working as a volunteer in our organisation, especially during conservation and environment workshops. In any activity, always have access to a mobile phone if at all possible or be aware of the location of the nearest telephone in case of an emergency. Additionally, if you are unsure about the safe method of performing any task, don't hesitate to ask for assistance from your Volunteer Supervisor.

We strongly encourage volunteers to wear clothing and footwear appropriate for the weather and the location. Be cautious about the possible presence of snakes in the area.

Inform HBWC immediately and stop working if you feel unwell. We will provide safety equipment when appropriate and it is mandatory to wear it while performing certain tasks.

Please report any accident to the HBWC Committee, Volunteer Supervisors, or staff so you can obtain first aid and we will file an incident report.

Smoking and alcohol consumption are not permitted inside or around the perimeter of any HBWC buildings. If volunteers feel uncomfortable, they should leave the area immediately and contact the HBWC Committee, Volunteer Coordinators, or staff.
